President's Message

Greetings fellow residents. Hopefully the hot summer weather will be coming to an end shortly and then we can all look forward to the beautiful fall colors. Schools are open and residents are reminded to be on the lookout for school buses picking up or dropping off students. Remember, on all streets in Ironwood, the speed limit is 30 MPH.

As I have reported in previous newsletters, your Board continues to work on finalizing the proposed new bylaws so they can be presented to the members of the IHOA to vote on. As I write this message in mid August, the Board has completed a final review with the Board's attorney and will be deciding at its September meeting when and how to make the proposed new bylaws available to membership for their review. The new bylaws will be voted on at the 2022 annual membership meeting this coming January. You will receive a ballot along with your annual dues notice in late December. The Board is hoping to get a large percentage of ballots returned, so please vote. It is also important that there is a quorum present, either in person or by proxy, so business can be conducted at the annual meeting. If you will not be able to attend the annual meeting in person, please make sure to sign and return the proxy along with your ballot.

The Board has also been working on some modifications to the current fence guidelines and will complete this task in time to present them to the membership and vote on them at the annual meeting. Be sure to watch your email or check the ihoa. org website periodically for current information on both the proposed bylaws and the proposed fence guidelines.

With fall arriving, the Town of Normal will begin its leaf pick up in late October or early November. The Board would remind residents that raking leaves into the gutter can cause problem with the functioning of the storm sewers. Leaves should be raked to the front of your property, but not be allowed to fall into the gutters.

Finally, if any resident is interested in contributing to the sub-division by serving on the IHOA Board of Directors, they should contact and submit their name to any current Board member. The Board would like to include brief bios of candidates in the December newsletter, so it is important that you submit your name by early November if you are interested.

Covenants Reminders

Letters from the Town or Homeowners Association

You may receive a letter from the Town Inspections Department and/or IHOA regarding a violation on your property that the Town has an ordinance about or is related to a subdivision covenant. The Town and Homeowners Association work together in keeping our subdivision appealing and within the boundaries of the ordinances and covenants. Thank you to all who maintain your property accordingly.

Parking Recreational Vehicles for Winter Maintenance

During the Fall months, the necessary clean-up and maintenance of boats and campers is expected. Parking your vehicle for a very short time in the drive is acceptable while completing the needed tasks prior to storage. The property owners who notify Board members about the vehicle/s is appreciated.

As a reminder, Ironwood covenants are very direct in relation to **trailers, boats, campers, and golf cart storage.** Article V, Section 17 in the IHOA covenants states: "No truck, travel trailer, recreational type vehicle, mobile home, boat, trailer,....shall be kept on the lot or in the subdivision except entirely within an enclosed structure. All automobiles kept or stored on said premises not enclosed in a permanent structure or building shall be in a workable and running condition...." All property owners who choose to own these types of equipment are asked to abide by the covenants of the subdivision for the betterment of Ironwood.

A Note from Town of Normal Public Works

Leaves Will be Falling

September and October bring out the rakes to gather the many crisp leaves. Vacuum leaf collection starts mid to late October and continues for about 7 to 8 weeks.

Be reminded:

- -- Leaves are not to be placed in the street. Leaves left in the street block storm water inlets and can cause flooding. They also can cause traffic issues. Rake them just to the curb, remaining on the parkway and/or lawn.
- -- Remove sticks and other items from the leaf pile.
- -- Collection will typically occur 3 to 5 times during the fall collection season and the time between collections may be as long as 3 weeks during heavy leaf fall. Be patient.
- -- Open burning in the Town of Normal is prohibited.

The likelihood of following the timeline of when the leave vacuums will be in Ironwood can usually be found on the Town website.

Grass Clippings Are Not for the Street

As you continue to mow during these cooler Fall months, you are reminded **grass clippings are not to be blown into the street**. Grass and debris along and in the street curbs eventually end up in the sewer system which can cause flooding and multiple other issues. Grass in the streets can also become very slick and dangerous for the many bike riders and motorcyclists in the neighborhood.

If you mow your clippings into the street, you are requested to sweep them up and dispose of them at the Town Landscape Waste Drop Site on Warriner Street in Normal. It is open 24/7. Dirt, sod, and grass clippings are accepted along with vegetation.

Bulky Waste Collection Reminders

Bulky waste is the large, individual household items that do not fit in your garbage bin/cart. It is collected each Friday in Ironwood.

Items put out for bulky collection should follow these guidelines:

- -- Must be at the curb, not in the street. Just like the leaves, they are to be left just at the curb, remaining on the grass/parkway area.
- -- Separate the bulky loose items from the garbage bins, brush, and landscape waste.
- -- Must be three or more feet from any obstructions such as trees, hydrants, parked cars, wires, fences, etc.
- -- Flattened cardboard can be included

Any questions about waste collection, recycling, sewers, traffic signs, and snowplowing can be answered by the Public Works Services department.

Tronwood Golf Course Update


The golf season is off and running and the golf staff has been working diligently to keep the course in great condition for the golfing public. A few projects have been underway, and I would like to take this time to update you on those.

- Bearlier in the month of August, our staff mowed the tall grass areas to help keep weed pressure down. Staff will be out spot spraying areas soon. Golf course staff will also try and mow the tall grass again in late fall.
- Pond aerators were installed earlier this year and they have been running well so far. We have plans to purchase more carp and other fish to continue to improve the ecosystem.
